WHEREAS, as of March 5, 2024, the Board of Supervisors of Butler County, State of Iowa, has elected to reallocate the \$600,000 of the FY24 ARPA appropriated dollars for

ect and its Accomplishments to Date:

The above-mentioned project involves improvements to the City of Allison's wastewater treatment plant.

The general scope of the project includes the installation of a NitroOx MBBR system ahead of a quiescent cell and ultraviolet disinfection. This includes: fine bubble aeration installed cell 1 & 2: Two 25 hp displacement blowers; Two train MBBR system with two tanks each; Two 20 hp blowers: and ultraviolet disinfection with 2 banks in series with backup generator.

The project was first developed in response to a needs assessment completed by CGA Consultants, DNR requirements, and engineering reports and was discussed at numerous Allison City Council meetinas.

In March 2022, the City submitted a funding application for CDBG funds under the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program as administered by the lowa Economic Development Authority (IEDA). The City was awarded \$300,000 in CDBG funding from IEDA for this project in the summer of 2022, which was the entire amount requested by the city. The CDBG funds are being matched to local funds from the city through the state revolving loan fund pro-

gram. The economic impact of this project includes reducing rising water rates and ensuring the vitality of the wastewater treatment system.

The project's location is the City's wastewater treatment plant, west of town. The Project Engineer is CGA Consultants; the Prime or General contractor is Boomerang, Inc.; and the CDBG Grant Administrator is INRCOG.

Summary of the Expenditures through March 11, 2024 (through CDBG Draw #4):

The total project budget was estimated to be \$3,702,450. In addition to \$300,000 in CDBG funds, the city provided \$3,372,450 in local funds. The table below is a summary of project expenses, through
