Council members Donald Bonzer, Robyn Holden, Michael Klinefelter, Jared Krull, and Garrett Schuldt were present. City Attorney Bruce Toenjes, Public Works Director Mike Tellinghuisen, Brian Schoon of INRCOG, and Casey Reints were in the audience.

Motion by Schuldt seconded by Bonzer to approve the agenda with any additions. Ayes-Bonzer, Holden, Klinefelter, Krull, and Schuldt. Nays-None. Motion carried.

Brian Schoon from INRCOG discussed the current zoning districts and zoning ordinance with the council. Council will review the options for the addition of different zoning districts and decide on possible changes to the zoning ordinance at a future meeting and if changes are to be made, then sending the matter to the Planning and Zoning Committee.

West Water Street road and right of way width discrepancies between individual property owner's abstracts and the Butler County map overlay were discussed. Council member Holden will discuss these issues with the Butler County Auditor's Office to try to get these issues re-

solved.

Motion by Schuldt seconded by Holden to approve a change request for the Shell Rock Community Aquatic Center to add an additional family restroom onto the equipment building in the amount of \$30,390. The reason for this request is that there needed to be an additional urinal in the men's restroom due to the state requirements and USAquatics not having the additional urinal in the original plans. The cost for adding an additional urinal in the men's restroom would be \$17,560, therefore the council decided on an entire additional restroom. Ayes-Bonzer, Holden, Klinefelter, and Schuldt. Nays-None. Abstain-Krull, due to conflict of interest. Motion carried.

The council agreed to offer the use of the Boyd Building to the Butler County Court System, if needed during this

COVID-19 pandemic.

Council expressed appreciation to Molly Muntefering and Patricia Franzen for volunteering in weeding some of the areas between the Shell Rock sign and the Kwik Star. There will be a community weed pulling day on Aug. 29 to pull more weeds in these areas. Please visit the city's website for more details.
