OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS CITY OF ALLISON COUNCIL MINUTES AUGUST 26, 2019

Regular Meeting:

Mayor Blockhus opened the regular meeting at 5:15 p.m. Council members present were: Bangasser, Cramer, Davis, Heuer and Platter. Others in attendance were: Trent Stirling, Bailey Johnson, Cindi Johnson, Shane Carlson, Ryan Henrichs, Ben Thorne, Brett Cooper, Chris Showalter, Rick Wehrhan, Billie Wehrhan, Bethany Carson – Tribune-Journal. Bangasser made a motion to approve the agenda with a second by Heuer. Ayes: All. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Open Forum:

No Open Forum items discussed.

Consent Agenda:

Davis made a motion to approve the consent agenda with the stipulation that the fence of Jared Hulbert is built to follow our code. Second by Heuer. Those items approved were:

Approve Minutes from Meeting on Aug. 12, 2019.

Approve Tabled Item: Building Permit for Brad Hansen, 815 Pine Street – Skid mounted portable building with rock base on his portion of vacated street.

Approve Building Permit – Russell Miller, 221 N. Main – Put steel shipping container beside storage building at car wash (will not be bolted or anchored down).

Approve Building Permit – Jared Hulbert, 821 Walnut – Privacy fence.

Approve Variance and Building Permit for Billie Wehrhan, 711 Eighth Street – Tear down old garage and attach a post framed garage onto home and be closer to lot line than allowed by Ordinance.

Approve Building Permit – Mercylene, 502 Locust – Remove and replace monument sign.

Approve Building Permit – Trinity Reformed Church Parsonage, 604 Cherry Street – Utility Shed on skids on concrete slab.

Ayes: All. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

New Business:

Bangasser made a motion to approve Resolution #19-08.3 with a second by Cramer – Resolution approving the transfer of \$7,802.12 from general fund interest to ambulance reserves interest line. Ayes: All. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Davis made a motion to approve Resolution #19-08.4 – Resolution approving the transfer of \$701.84 from general fund interest to a fire reserves interest line. Second by Heuer. Ayes: All. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Bailey and Cindi Johnson were present at the meeting representing the ambulance crew and asked if they could spend the money earned from interest on ambulance CD's to equip the new ambulance. Council stated that they saw no problem with that.

Shane Carlson, Ryan Henrichs, Ben

Thorne and Brett Cooper – representing the fire department – asked council if it would be OK to proceed with the purchase of a new ATV. The current Gator that they have sets too low to the ground and gets stuck so easily. They would give the Gator to the ambulance crew as they could use it if a bike trail incidents should occur or at the Butler County Fair. They have gotten a price from Deike Implement in Waverly for a slightly used unit with an original new cost of \$18,000 for the reduced price of \$14,500. They have their own funds to pay for the unit. Motion by Bangasser with a second by Davis to approve the fire department to purchase the new ATV for the cost of \$14,500. Ayes: All. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The possible vacation of Third Street where it intersects with Walnut Street was discussed and Trent brought up the fact that we have sewer and water lines that run through that street. The City Attorney will be contacted as to if a vacation of a street should be made in those circumstances.

Davis made a motion to start the action of vacating Maple Street where it intersects with N. Railroad Ave near Joel Sults property. Second by Platter. Ayes: All. Nays: None. Motion carried.

The agenda item for the sign on Pfaltzgraff Street pointing to the Allison Bible Church was tabled until the church can provide further information.

Quotes from three different companies were obtained for a new copier and new printers for Glenda and Chris' desks. Cramer made a motion with a second by Bangasser to approve the purchase of a Xerox Altalink C8030/T2 Color Multi-function printer/copier and two Lexmark mono single function printers from Advanced Systems at a total cost of \$4,509 with maintenance agreements on each unit. Ayes: All. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Old Business:

Council discussed with Chris Showalter where there would be land available in the city limits on which to build a 60' X 136' post frame storage building for Emergency Management and the Sheriff's office.

Motion by Platter with a second by Cramer to allow Crystal Plumbing & Heating to dump the material from their septic pumping trucks in our septic system at a rate of \$0.03 per gallon. Ayes: Cramer, Davis, Heuer and Platter. Nays: Bangasser. Motion carried. They will be told which dump station they should use and ask them to contact our public works department before they dump each time and that payment should be made to the City quarterly.

Meeting called to order at 9 a.m., by Chairman Rusty Eddy with members Greg Barnett and Tom Heidenwirth present. Also present were Engineer John Risher, Chris Luhring, Parkersburg, Iowa, Fern Feldman, Allison, Iowa and Casey Reints, Mid-America Publishing.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved as read. Also present was Sheriff Jason Johnson.

Moved by Eddy, second by Barnett to approve the following:

RESOLUTION NO. 932

RESOLUTION SETTING DATES OF A CONSULTATION AND A PUBLIC HEARING ON A PROPOSED AMENDMENT NO. 5 TO THE BUTLER COUNTY LOGISTICS PARK URBAN RENEWAL PLAN IN BUTLER COUNTY, STATE OF IOWA

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 692, adopted April 27, 2010, this Board found and determined that certain areas located within the County are eligible and should be designated as an urban renewal area under Iowa law, and approved and adopted the Butler County Logistics Park Urban Renewal Plan (the "Plan") for the Butler County Logistics Park Urban Renewal Area (the "Urban Renewal Area" or "Area") described therein, which Plan is on file in the office of the Recorder of Butler County, Iowa; and

WHEREAS, the Plan has subsequently been amended, lastly by an Amendment No. 4, adopted by Resolution No. 884, on Sept. 26, 2017; and

WHEREAS, this Urban Renewal Area currently includes and consists of: ORIGINAL AREA

1. The entire existing county road right-of-way of Butler County Road 220th Street (old Highway #3) lying between Butler County Road T55 (Terrace Avenue) on the West and Iowa Highway #3 on the East.

2. The entire existing county road right-of-way of Butler County Road Willow Avenue lying between 220th Street on the North and the North city limits of the City of Shell Rock, Iowa on the South.

3. The entire existing county road right-of-way of Butler County Road T55 (Terrace Avenue) lying between Iowa Highway #3 on the North and Butler County Road C45 (Butler Center Road) on the South.

4. The entire existing county road right-of-way of Butler County Road Union Avenue lying between Iowa Highway #3 on the North and 220th Street (old Highway #3) on the South.

5. The entire existing county road right-of-way of Butler County Road 212th Street lying between Union Avenue on the West and Vail Avenue on the East, except that portion vacated and described in document recorded as Instrument #2007-2171 with the Butler County Recorder.

6. The entire existing county road right-of-way of Butler County Road Vail Avenue lying between 220th Street on the South and 212th Street on the North.

7. The entire existing county road right-of-way of Butler County Road Utica Avenue lying between Iowa Highway #3 on the North and 212th Street on the South.

8. The entire Section 33, Township 92 North, Range 15 West of the 5th P.M. Butler County, Iowa and all existing county road right-of-way lying inside and adjacent to said Section 33.

AMENDMENT NO. 1 AREA

1. The entire existing road right-of-way of Butler County Road C45/T55 (Butler Center Road) between Butler County Road T55 (Terrace Ave) on the West and Butler County Road T55 (Temple Ave) on the East.

2. The entire existing road right-of-way of Butler County Road T55 (Temple Ave) lying between Butler County Road C45 (Butler Center Road) on the North and Butler County Road C55 (290th Street) on the South.

3. The entire existing road right-of-way of Butler County Road C55 (280th Street) lying between Butler County Road T55 (Temple Ave) on the West and Butler County Road T63 (Willow Ave) on the

East.

4. The entire Section 32, Township 91 North, Range 15 West of the 5th p.m, Butler County, Iowa and all existing county road right-of-way lying inside and adjacent to said Section 32.

AMENDMENT NO. 2 AREA

The following describes location for Gas Utility Route A.

1. The entire existing road right-of-way of Butler County Road Logistics Park Drive lying between its North terminus and Butler County Road 220th Street on the South.

2. The entire existing road right of way of Butler County Road 220th Street lying between Butler County Road Logistics Park Drive on the West and Butler County Road Victory Lane on the East.

The following describes location for Gas Utility Route B.

3. The entire existing road right of way of 220th Street lying between Butler County Road Victory Lane on the West and Iowa Highway 3 on the East.

4. The entire existing road right-of-way of Iowa Highway 3 lying between Butler County Road 220th Street on the West and Butler County Road T63 (North Public Road & Yale Ave) on the East.

5. The entire existing road right-of-way of Butler County Road T63 (North Public Road & Yale Ave) between Iowa Highway 3 on the South and Existing Shell Rock TBS on the North.

The following describes location for Gas Utility Route C.

6. The entire existing road right-of-way of Butler County Road Victory Lane lying between Butler County Road 220th Street on the South and Iowa Highway 3 on the North.

7. The entire existing road right-of-way of Iowa Highway 3 lying between Butler County Road Vintage Lane on the West and Butler County Road 220th Street on the East.

8. A strip of land described as the south 100ft of Butler County Parcel #'s 08-34-400-041, 08-35-301-040, 08-35-302-040, and 08-35-326-045.

9. The entire existing road right-of-way of Butler County Road Wildwood Place lying between its West terminus and Butler County Road Walnut Ave on the East.

10. The entire existing road right-of-way of Butler County Road Walnut Ave lying between Butler County Road Wildwood Place on the West and Butler County Road T63 (North Public Road & Yale Ave) on the East.

11. The entire existing road right-of-way of Butler County Road T63 (North Public Road & Yale Ave) between Butler County Road Walnut Ave on the North and Existing Shell Rock TBS on the South.

Note: The Gas Utility Route will include Route A and either Route B or C, to be determined by Mid-American Energy.

AMENDMENT NO. 3 AREA

1. The entire existing road right-of-way of Butler County Road C55 (280th Street) lying between Butler County Road T55 (Temple Ave.) on the East and Iowa Highway 14 on the West.

2. The entire existing road right-of-way of Butler County Road T47 (Sinclair Ave.) lying between Butler County Road C55 (290th Street) on the North and Iowa Highway 57 on the South.

3. A tract of land described as beginning at a point 12.83½ chains south of the Northwest corner of the SW ¼ of Section 27, Township 90 North, Range 16 West of the 5th P.M. thence Southeasterly along northerly line of property formerly known as ICRR Depot Ground 20.79 chains to a point on the East line of the W ½ SW ¼ of said Section 27, being 18.565 chains south of the Northeast corner of said W ½ SW ¼, thence south along said East line boundary to a point 350 feet north of the SE corner of Lot 17 of the subdivision of the SW ¼ of said Section 27, thence Northwesterly to a point on the West line of said Section 27 being 450 feet north of the SW corner of said section 27, thence along west line of said Section 27 to the point of beginning.

4. The entire existing road right-of-way of Butler County Road T63 (Yale Ave.) lying between Butler County Road C33 (190th Street) on the North and Iowa Highway 3 on the South.

5. The entire existing road right-of-way of Walnut Avenue lying between Butler County Road T63 (Yale Avenue) on the East and the Menard's Entrance on the West.

6. The entire existing road right-of-way of Glen Hall Road lying between Iowa Highway 3 on the South and the Menard's Entrance on the North.

7. A tract of land lying in both the NE ¼ of Section 2, Township 91 North, Range 15 West of the 5th P.M. and the SE ¼ of Section 35, Township 92 North, Range 15 West of the 5th P.M.; more particularly described in Exhibit "A" of Instrument No. 2008-0078 as recorded in the office of the Butler County, Iowa Recorder.

WHEREAS, County staff has caused there to be prepared a form of Amendment No. 5 to the Plan ("Amendment No. 5" or "Amendment"), a copy of which has been placed on file for public inspection in the office of the County Auditor and which is incorporated herein by reference, the purpose of which is to add property to the Urban Renewal Area and to add and/or confirm the list of eligible projects to be undertaken within the Urban Renewal Area; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable that the area be redeveloped as part of the overall redevelopment covered by the Plan, as amended; and

WHEREAS, this proposed Amendment No. 5 to the Urban Renewal Area adds land as follows:

1. The entire existing road right-of-way of Butler County Road T47 (Sinclair Ave) lying between Butler County Road C55 (290th Street) on the South and Iowa Highway 3 on the North.

2. The entire existing road right-of-way of Butler County Road C45 (240th Street) lying between Iowa Highway 14 on the West and Butler County Road T63 (Willow Ave) on the East.

WHEREAS, the land proposed to be added to the Urban Renewal Area includes property within, or within two miles of, the City of Shell Rock, Iowa, and the County will enter into a joint agreement with said city to allow the County to operate within the Area; and

WHEREAS, the Iowa statutes require the Board of Supervisors to notify all affected taxing entities of the consideration being given to the proposed Amendment No. 5 and to hold a consultation with such taxing entities with respect thereto, and further provides that the designated representative of each affected taxing entity may attend the consultation and make written recommendations for modifications to the proposed division of revenue included as a part thereof, to which the County shall submit written responses as provided in Section 403.5, Code of Iowa, as amended; and

WHEREAS, the Iowa statutes further require the Board of Supervisors to hold a public hearing on the proposed Amendment No. 5 subsequent to notice thereof by publication in at least one newspaper having general circulation within the County, which notice shall describe the time, date, place and purpose of the hearing, shall generally identify the urban renewal area covered by the Amendment and shall outline the general scope of the urban renewal project under consideration, with a copy of the notice also being mailed to each affected taxing entity.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF BUTLER COUNTY, STATE OF IOWA:

That the consultation on the proposed Amendment No. 5 required by Section 403.5(2), Code of Iowa, as amended, shall be held on the August 27, 2019, in the Board Room, Butler County Courthouse, 428 Sixth Street, Allison, Iowa, at 1 p.m., and the County Auditor, or her delegate, is hereby appointed to serve as the designated representative of the County for purposes of conducting the consultation, receiving any recommendations that may be made with respect thereto and responding to the same in accordance with Section 403.5(2), Code of Iowa.

That the County Auditor is authorized and directed to cause a notice of such consultation to be sent by regular mail to all affected taxing entities, as defined in

Section 403.17(1), Code of Iowa, along with a copy of this Resolution and the proposed Amendment No. 5, the notice to be in substantially the following form:

NOTICE OF A CONSULTATION TO BE HELD BETWEEN BUTLER COUNTY, STATE OF IOWA AND ALL AFFECTED TAXING ENTITIES CONCERNING THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT NO. 5 TO THE BUTLER COUNTY LOGISTICS PARK URBAN RENEWAL PLAN FOR BUTLER COUNTY, STATE OF IOWA

Butler County, State of Iowa will hold a consultation with all affected taxing entities, as defined in Section 403.17(1), Code of Iowa, as amended, commencing at 1 p.m., on Aug. 27, 2019, in the Board Room, Butler County Courthouse, 428 Sixth St., Allison, Iowa concerning a proposed Amendment No. 5 to the Butler County Logistics Park Urban Renewal Plan for an Urban Renewal Area, a copy of which is attached hereto.

Each affected taxing entity may appoint a representative to attend the consultation. The consultation may include a discussion of the estimated growth in valuation of taxable property included in the Urban Renewal Area, the fiscal impact of the division of revenue on the affected taxing entities, the estimated impact on the provision of services by each of the affected taxing entities in the Urban Renewal Area, and the duration of any bond issuance included in the Amendment.

The designated representative of any affected taxing entity may make written recommendations for modifications to the proposed division of revenue no later than seven days following the date of the consultation. The County Auditor, or her delegate, as the designated representative of Butler County, State of Iowa, shall submit a written response to the affected taxing entity, no later than seven days prior to the public hearing on the proposed Amendment No. 5 to the Butler County Logistics Park Urban Renewal Plan, addressing any recommendations made by that entity for modification to the proposed division of revenue.

This notice is given by order of the Board of Supervisors of Butler County, State of Iowa, as provided by Section 403.5, Code of Iowa, as amended.

The Board of Supervisors of Butler County, State of Iowa, will hold a public hearing before itself at its meeting which commences at 9:05 A.M. on September 17, 2019 in the Board Room, Butler County Courthouse, 428 Sixth St., Allison, Iowa, to consider adoption of a proposed Amendment No. 5 to the Butler County

Logistics Park Urban Renewal Plan (the "Amendment") concerning an Urban Renewal Area in Butler County, State of Iowa, which Amendment adds the following property to the Urban Renewal Area:

3. The entire existing road right-of-way of Butler County Road T47 (Sinclair Ave) lying between Butler County Road C55 (290th Street) on the South and Iowa Highway 3 on the North.

4. The entire existing road right-of-way of Butler County Road C45 (240th Street) lying between Iowa Highway 14 on the West and Butler County Road T63 (Wil-

low Ave) on the East.

A copy of the Amendment is on file for public inspection in the office of the County Auditor, Butler County Courthouse, Allison, Iowa.

Butler County, State of Iowa is the local public agency which, if such Amendment is approved, shall undertake the urban renewal activities described in such Amendment.

The general scope of the urban renewal activities under consideration in the Amendment is to promote the growth and retention of qualified industries and businesses in the Urban Renewal Area through various public purpose and special financing activities outlined in the Amendment. To accomplish the objectives of the Amendment, and to encourage the further economic development of the Urban Renewal Area, the Amendment provides that such special financing activities may include, but not be limited to, the making of loans or grants of public funds to private entities under Chapter 15A, Code of Iowa. The County also may reimburse or directly undertake the installation, construction and reconstruction of substantial public improvements, including, but not limited to, street, water, sanitary sewer, storm sewer or other public improvements. The Amendment provides that the County may issue bonds or use available funds for purposes allowed by the Plan, as amended, and that tax increment reimbursement of the costs of urban renewal projects may be sought if and to the extent incurred by the County. The Amendment initially proposes specific public infrastructure or site improvements to be undertaken by the County, and provides that the Amendment may be amended from time to time.

The proposed Amendment No. 5 would add property to the Urban Renewal Area and add and/or confirm the list of eligible projects to be undertaken within the Urban Renewal Area.

Other provisions of the Plan not affected by the Amendment would remain in full force and effect.

Any person or organization desiring to be heard shall be afforded an opportunity to be heard at such hearing.

This notice is given by order of the Board of Supervisors of Butler County, State of Iowa, as provided by Section 403.5, Code of Iowa.

3. The entire existing county road right-of-way of Butler County Road T55 (Terrace Avenue) lying between Iowa Highway #3 on the North and Butler County Road C45 (Butler Center Road) on the South.

4. The entire existing county road right-of-way of Butler County Road Union Avenue lying between Iowa Highway #3 on the North and 220th Street (old Highway #3) on the South.

5. The entire existing county road right-of-way of Butler County Road 212th Street lying between Union Avenue on the West and Vail Avenue on the East, except that portion vacated and described in document recorded as Instrument #2007-2171 with the Butler County Recorder.

6. The entire existing county road right-of-way of Butler County Road Vail Avenue lying between 220th Street on the South and 212th Street on the North.

7. The entire existing county road right-of-way of Butler County Road Utica Avenue lying between Iowa Highway #3 on the North and 212th Street on the South.

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AMENDMENT NO. 1 AREA

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2. The entire existing road right-of-way of Butler County Road T55 (Temple Ave) lying between Butler County Road C45 (Butler Center Road) on the North and Butler County Road C55 (290th Street) on the South.

3. The entire existing road right-of-way of Butler County Road C55 (280th Street) lying between Butler County Road T55 (Temple Ave) on the West and Butler County Road T63 (Willow Ave) on the

East.

4. The entire Section 32, Township 91 North, Range 15 West of the 5th p.m, Butler County, Iowa and all existing county road right-of-way lying inside and adjacent to said Section 32.

AMENDMENT NO. 2 AREA

The following describes location for Gas Utility Route A.

1. The entire existing road right-of-way of Butler County Road Logistics Park Drive lying between its North terminus and Butler County Road 220th Street on the South.

2. The entire existing road right of way of Butler County Road 220th Street lying between Butler County Road Logistics Park Drive on the West and Butler County Road Victory Lane on the East.

The following describes location for Gas Utility Route B.

3. The entire existing road right of way of 220th Street lying between Butler County Road Victory Lane on the West and Iowa Highway 3 on the East.

4. The entire existing road right-of-way of Iowa Highway 3 lying between Butler County Road 220th Street on the West and Butler County Road T63 (North Public Road & Yale Ave) on the East.

5. The entire existing road right-of-way of Butler County Road T63 (North Public Road & Yale Ave) between Iowa Highway 3 on the South and Existing Shell Rock TBS on the North.

The following describes location for Gas Utility Route C.

6. The entire existing road right-of-way of Butler County Road Victory Lane lying between Butler County Road 220th Street on the South and Iowa Highway 3 on the North.

7. The entire existing road right-of-way of Iowa Highway 3 lying between Butler County Road Vintage Lane on the West and Butler County Road 220th Street on the East.

8. A strip of land described as the south 100ft of Butler County Parcel #'s 08-34-400-041, 08-35-301-040, 08-35-302-040, and 08-35-326-045.

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10. The entire existing road right-of-way of Butler County Road Walnut Ave lying between Butler County Road Wildwood Place on the West and Butler County Road T63 (North Public Road & Yale Ave) on the East.

11. The entire existing road right-of-way of Butler County Road T63 (North Public Road & Yale Ave) between Butler County Road Walnut Ave on the North and Existing Shell Rock TBS on the South.

4. The entire existing road right-of-way of Butler County Road T63 (Yale Ave.) lying between Butler County Road C33 (190th Street) on the North and Iowa Highway 3 on the South.

5. The entire existing road right-of-way of Walnut Avenue lying between Butler County Road T63 (Yale Avenue) on the East and the Menard's Entrance on the West.

6. The entire existing road right-of-way of Glen Hall Road lying between Iowa Highway 3 on the South and the Menard's Entrance on the North.

7. A tract of land lying in both the NE ¼ of Section 2, Township 91 North, Range 15 West of the 5th P.M. and the SE ¼ of Section 35, Township 92 North, Range 15 West of the 5th P.M.; more particularly described in Exhibit "A" of Instrument No. 2008-0078 as recorded in the office of the Butler County, Iowa Recorder.

WHEREAS, County staff has caused there to be prepared a form of Amendment No. 5 to the Plan ("Amendment No. 5" or "Amendment"), a copy of which has been placed on file for public inspection in the office of the County Auditor and which is incorporated herein by reference, the purpose of which is to add property to the Urban Renewal Area and to add and/or confirm the list of eligible projects to be undertaken within the Urban Renewal Area; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable that the area be redeveloped as part of the overall redevelopment covered by the Plan, as amended; and

WHEREAS, this proposed Amendment No. 5 to the Urban Renewal Area adds land as follows:

1. The entire existing road right-of-way of Butler County Road T47 (Sinclair Ave) lying between Butler County Road C55 (290th Street) on the South and Iowa Highway 3 on the North.

WHEREAS, the Iowa statutes further require the Board of Supervisors to hold a public hearing on the proposed Amendment No. 5 subsequent to notice thereof by publication in at least one newspaper having general circulation within the County, which notice shall describe the time, date, place and purpose of the hearing, shall generally identify the urban renewal area covered by the Amendment and shall outline the general scope of the urban renewal project under consideration, with a copy of the notice also being mailed to each affected taxing entity.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF BUTLER COUNTY, STATE OF IOWA:

That the consultation on the proposed Amendment No. 5 required by Section 403.5(2), Code of Iowa, as amended, shall be held on the August 27, 2019, in the Board Room, Butler County Courthouse, 428 Sixth Street, Allison, Iowa, at 1 p.m., and the County Auditor, or her delegate, is hereby appointed to serve as the designated representative of the County for purposes of conducting the consultation, receiving any recommendations that may be made with respect thereto and responding to the same in accordance with Section 403.5(2), Code of Iowa.

That the County Auditor is authorized and directed to cause a notice of such consultation to be sent by regular mail to all affected taxing entities, as defined in

Section 403.17(1), Code of Iowa, along with a copy of this Resolution and the proposed Amendment No. 5, the notice to be in substantially the following form:
