Meeting called to order at 9 a.m. by Chairman Rusty Eddy with member Tom Heidenwirth present. Member Greg Barnett was absent. Also present were Emergency Management Coordinator Chris Showalter, Engineer John Riherd, Shawna Lebeck, Visions of Well-Being, Dustin Brocka, Cedar Falls, Iowa and Bethany Carson, Mid-America Publishing.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved as read.

Board held a public hearing on a Construction Permit Application for a new swine facility for DCI Bennezette 2, owner DCI, LLC. Location of proposed facility is in the SE¼ of the NW¼ of Section 3-93-18 in Bennezette Township. Present were Emergency Management Coordinator Chris Showalter, Engineer John Riherd, Shawna Lebeck, Visions of Well-Being, Dustin Brocka, Cedar Falls, Iowa and Bethany Carson, Mid-America Publishing. Auditor reported no written or oral comments received. Hearing no comments in the room, Chairman Eddy closed the public hearing.

Board held public hearing to consider adoption of Ordinance Title VI, No. 16, an Ordinance Amending the Official Zoning Map. Present were Emergency Management Coordinator Chris Showalter, Engineer John Riherd, Shawna Lebeck, Visions of Well-Being, Dustin Brocka, Cedar Falls, Iowa and Bethany Carson, Mid-America Publishing. Auditor reported no written or oral comments received. At the close of the public hearing, it was moved by Heidenwirth, second by Eddy to approve said amendment. Barnett was absent. Motion carried. It was further moved by Heidenwirth, second by Eddy to waive the second and third readings of said Ordinance. Barnett was absent. Motion carried.

ORDINANCE TITLE VI, No. 16 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE OFFICIAL ZONING MAP, WHICH IS CONSIDERED PART OF BUTLER COUNTY, IOWA ZONING

ORDINANCE (ORDINANCE TITLE VI, NO. 8, ADOPTED ON MAY 25, 2004)

Section 1.1 RESCISSION. This Ordinance rescinds the current zoning designation, "M" Manufacturing, on the property legally described as:

Commencing at a point 450 feet West of the center of the North-east Quarter (NE¼) of Section Three (3), Township Ninety-one (91) North, Range Fifteen (15) West of the 5th P.M. in Butler County, Iowa, thence running West 1,594 feet, thence South 820 feet, thence East 1,594 feet, thence North 820 feet, to the point of beginning, containing 30 acres, more or less, on the Official Zoning Map as was originally adopted.

Section 1.2 RESCISSION. This Ordinance rescinds the current zoning designation, Agricultural A-1, on the property legally described as:

All of the Northwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter (NW¼ NW¼) lying North and East of the C.R.I. & P. Railway except a tract commencing 33 feet East and 33 feet South of the Northwest corner of said NW¼ NW¼ (at which point a Highway Commission survey stake is located), thence South 300 feet, thence East at right angles 498 feet, thence Northwesterly 369 ft. 8 in. to a point which is 290 feet East of the point of beginning, thence West 290 feet to point of beginning.

All of the South One-half of the Northwest Quarter (S½ NW¼) East of the C.R.I. & P. Railway, except a tract beginning at the SE corner of SE¼ NW¼, thence West 450.03 ft., thence North 0°25'50" West 222.35 ft., thence East 454.13 ft. to the East line of the said SE¼ NW¼, thence South 0°37'35" West 222.36 ft. to the point of beginning; The Southwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter (SW¼ NE¼); except a tract commencing at a point 450 feet West of the center of the Northeast Quarter (NE¼) of Section Three (3), Township Ninety-one (91) North, Range Fifteen (15) West of the 5th P.M., thence running West 1,594 feet, thence South 820 feet, thence East 1,594 feet, thence North 820 feet to the point of beginning, containing 30 acres more or less, all in Section Three (3), Township Ninety-one (91) North, Range Fifteen (15) West of the 5th P.M. in Butler County, Iowa, on the Official Zoning Map as was originally adopted.

Section 2. ADOPTION. This Ordinance adopts in lieu thereof a new zoning designation "A-2", Agriculture, for the properties legally described above, on the Official Zoning Map.

Section 3. INTEGRATION WITH CODE. Each section, provision or part of this Ordinance which is followed by a section number shall be inserted in the Butler County Zoning Ordinance (Ordinance Title VI, No. 8, adopted on May 25,

2004) as indicated by said section number and hereafter shall be cited by reference to said section number.

Section 4. REPEALER. All ordinances and resolutions, parts thereof or amendments thereto, in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 5. SEVERABILITY OF REPEALER. All ordinances and resolutions, parts thereof or amendments thereto, not directly affected by this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 6. SEVERABILITY. If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such section, provision, or part shall be severable from the rest of the Ordinance, and such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole, or any section, provision or part not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 7. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its final passage and publication as provided by law.

PUBLIC HEARING AND FIRST PASSAGE (READING) on April 2, 2019.

SECOND PASSAGE (READING) on Waived.

THIRD AND FINAL PASSAGE (READING) AND ADOPTION on April 2, 2019. Board considered Proclamation Declaring April as Child Abuse Awareness Month. Also present were Director of Public Health Jennifer Becker and Public Health Secretary Nancy Hemann. Moved by Eddy, second by Heidenwirth to proclaim April as Child Abuse Prevention Month. Barnett was absent. Motion carried. Proclamation is as follows:

Child Abuse Prevention Month 2019 Proclamation

Whereas, our children are our most valuable resource and will shape the future of Butler County;

Whereas child abuse and neglect directly harms children and increases the likelihood of long-term physical and mental health problems, alcohol and substance abuse, continued family violence and criminal behavior;

Whereas, children suffering from child abuse are more likely to: engage in risky behavior, perform poorly in school, develop unhealthy relationships, suffer from depression, attempt suicide, and express violent aggression, and

Whereas, only \$1 is spent on preventing child abuse in Iowa for every \$50 spent on treating it; and

Whereas, Iowa is leading research efforts to better understand the negative long-term outcomes of child abuse and neglect among adults through the Adverse Childhood Experiences study (ACEs), which shows that poor physical health, mental health, and financial health in adulthood is attributed to adverse experiences in childhood, including abuse and neglect; and

Whereas, the risk of child abuse is reduced through strong social supports for adults and children; and

Whereas, research shows that the presence of one caring relationship in a child's life mitigates negative outcomes and reduces risk factors, resulting in better physical health, mental health, and financial health; and

Whereas, positive social supports for children and adults are key factors to improving social well-being in Iowa; and

Whereas, the Connections Matter® initiative supported by Together 4 Families and Butler County Visions of Well-Being promotes the development of positive social supports and communicates the healing power of relationships in children's development and the community's growth; and

Now Therefore, the Butler County Board of Supervisors, do hereby proclaim April 2019 as Child Abuse Prevention Month in Butler County and urge all citizens to in our community to increase their participation in building caring connections with families, thereby preventing child abuse and strengthening the community in which we live.

Chairman Rusty Eddy, In Testimony Whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused to be affixed the Great Seal of Butler County Iowa on this 2nd day of April, 2019.

Auditor reported no written or oral comments received. At the close of the public hearing, it was moved by Heidenwirth, second by Eddy to approve said amendment. Barnett was absent. Motion carried. It was further moved by Heidenwirth, second by Eddy to waive the second and third readings of said Ordinance. Barnett was absent. Motion carried.

ORDINANCE TITLE VI, No. 16 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE OFFICIAL ZONING MAP, WHICH IS CONSIDERED PART OF BUTLER COUNTY, IOWA ZONING

ORDINANCE (ORDINANCE TITLE VI, NO. 8, ADOPTED ON MAY 25, 2004)

Section 1.1 RESCISSION. This Ordinance rescinds the current zoning designation, "M" Manufacturing, on the property legally described as:

Commencing at a point 450 feet West of the center of the North-east Quarter (NE¼) of Section Three (3), Township Ninety-one (91) North, Range Fifteen (15) West of the 5th P.M. in Butler County, Iowa, thence running West 1,594 feet, thence South 820 feet, thence East 1,594 feet, thence North 820 feet, to the point of beginning, containing 30 acres, more or less, on the Official Zoning Map as was originally adopted.

Section 1.2 RESCISSION. This Ordinance rescinds the current zoning designation, Agricultural A-1, on the property legally described as:

All of the Northwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter (NW¼ NW¼) lying North and East of the C.R.I. & P. Railway except a tract commencing 33 feet East and 33 feet South of the Northwest corner of said NW¼ NW¼ (at which point a Highway Commission survey stake is located), thence South 300 feet, thence East at right angles 498 feet, thence Northwesterly 369 ft. 8 in. to a point which is 290 feet East of the point of beginning, thence West 290 feet to point of beginning.

All of the South One-half of the Northwest Quarter (S½ NW¼) East of the C.R.I. & P. Railway, except a tract beginning at the SE corner of SE¼ NW¼, thence West 450.03 ft., thence North 0°25'50" West 222.35 ft., thence East 454.13 ft. to the East line of the said SE¼ NW¼, thence South 0°37'35" West 222.36 ft. to the point of beginning; The Southwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter (SW¼ NE¼); except a tract commencing at a point 450 feet West of the center of the Northeast Quarter (NE¼) of Section Three (3), Township Ninety-one (91) North, Range Fifteen (15) West of the 5th P.M., thence running West 1,594 feet, thence South 820 feet, thence East 1,594 feet, thence North 820 feet to the point of beginning, containing 30 acres more or less, all in Section Three (3), Township Ninety-one (91) North, Range Fifteen (15) West of the 5th P.M. in Butler County, Iowa, on the Official Zoning Map as was originally adopted.

Section 2. ADOPTION. This Ordinance adopts in lieu thereof a new zoning designation "A-2", Agriculture, for the properties legally described above, on the Official Zoning Map.

Section 3. INTEGRATION WITH CODE. Each section, provision or part of this Ordinance which is followed by a section number shall be inserted in the Butler County Zoning Ordinance (Ordinance Title VI, No. 8, adopted on May 25,

2004) as indicated by said section number and hereafter shall be cited by reference to said section number.

Section 4. REPEALER. All ordinances and resolutions, parts thereof or amendments thereto, in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 5. SEVERABILITY OF REPEALER. All ordinances and resolutions, parts thereof or amendments thereto, not directly affected by this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 6. SEVERABILITY. If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such section, provision, or part shall be severable from the rest of the Ordinance, and such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole, or any section, provision or part not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 7. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its final passage and publication as provided by law.

PUBLIC HEARING AND FIRST PASSAGE (READING) on April 2, 2019.

SECOND PASSAGE (READING) on Waived.

THIRD AND FINAL PASSAGE (READING) AND ADOPTION on April 2, 2019. Board considered Proclamation Declaring April as Child Abuse Awareness Month. Also present were Director of Public Health Jennifer Becker and Public Health Secretary Nancy Hemann. Moved by Eddy, second by Heidenwirth to proclaim April as Child Abuse Prevention Month. Barnett was absent. Motion carried. Proclamation is as follows:

Child Abuse Prevention Month 2019 Proclamation

Whereas, our children are our most valuable resource and will shape the future of Butler County;

Whereas child abuse and neglect directly harms children and increases the likelihood of long-term physical and mental health problems, alcohol and substance abuse, continued family violence and criminal behavior;

Whereas, children suffering from child abuse are more likely to: engage in risky behavior, perform poorly in school, develop unhealthy relationships, suffer from depression, attempt suicide, and express violent aggression, and

Whereas, only \$1 is spent on preventing child abuse in Iowa for every \$50 spent on treating it; and

Whereas, Iowa is leading research efforts to better understand the negative long-term outcomes of child abuse and neglect among adults through the Adverse Childhood Experiences study (ACEs), which shows that poor physical health, mental health, and financial health in adulthood is attributed to adverse experiences in childhood, including abuse and neglect; and

Whereas, the risk of child abuse is reduced through strong social supports for adults and children; and

Whereas, research shows that the presence of one caring relationship in a child's life mitigates negative outcomes and reduces risk factors, resulting in better physical health, mental health, and financial health; and

Whereas, positive social supports for children and adults are key factors to improving social well-being in Iowa; and

Whereas, the Connections Matter® initiative supported by Together 4 Families and Butler County Visions of Well-Being promotes the development of positive social supports and communicates the healing power of relationships in children's development and the community's growth; and

Now Therefore, the Butler County Board of Supervisors, do hereby proclaim April 2019 as Child Abuse Prevention Month in Butler County and urge all citizens to in our community to increase their participation in building caring connections with families, thereby preventing child abuse and strengthening the community in which we live.
